DESECRATION OF OUR SOUTHERN HERITAGE CONTINUES WE MUST REMAIN EVER VIGILANT

A Confederate monument in Nashville's Centennial Park was found vandalized early morning June 17th. The bronze statue of a soldier was found with red paint splattered on it, and "they were racists" written on a side plaque. The vandalism covers the more than 500 names of the Frank Cheatham Bivouac, the group of United Confederate Veterans who commissioned the statue. It was erected in 1909.


